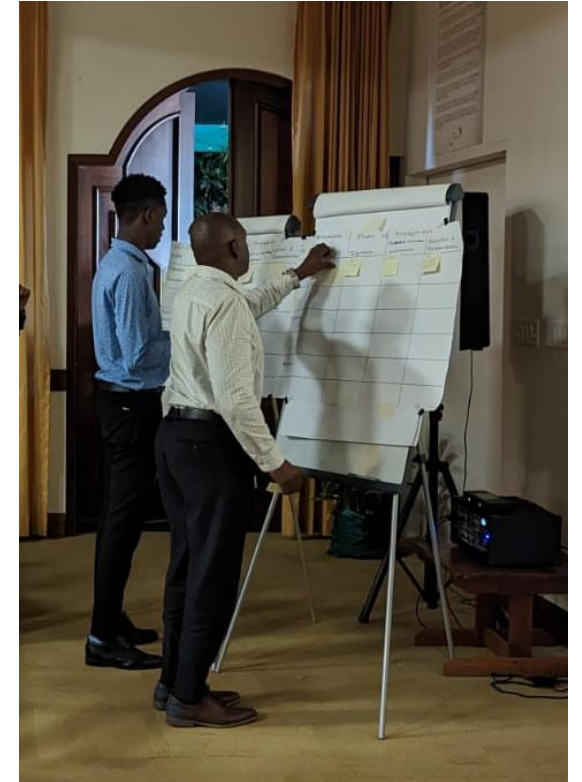

# RESULTS OF THE „STICKING NOTES“ EXERCISE

Recommendations will be considered in the **communication strategy** and role of the NDA in the **country coordination mechanism (commissions)** and the **stakeholder engagement plan**.

Other observations should be included in the **Country Programme** as readiness needs.





# RESULTS OF THE „STICKING NOTES“ EXERCISE

## Information to be required and provided

- Multiannual and annual plans (**Highlighting their climate change focus**)
- NDC and **polic/strategy development and needs**
- Guidelines / requirements to become an accredited entity
- Requirements for becoming an executing entity
- requirement for the different GCF roles to participate
- Knowledge exchange and technical advice
- **General GCF information**, incl. Project proposals and concept notes , stakeholder involvement, GCF Country Programme
- Updated **project** information, projects in development, proposal calls, pipeline, pilots results (**all climate-related projects? What kind of details?**)
- Climate data : droughts, rain, water flow
- Guidelines / requirements for engagement, documentation of engagement process and partnerships (**gender, ITP, and local conditions to be considered. Shared responsibilities, defined roles – SEP and country coordination mechanism as basic setting**).
- Receive email alerts on project possibilities
- Sea level monitoring data - Daily tidal change (**MAS: to receive or to provide?**)
- Work of the technical team/committee at ROM
- Intended energy sector database, Stakeholders of energy (**EAS: to receive or to provide?**)

# RESULTS OF THE „STICKING NOTES“ EXERCISE

## Methods of consultation / involvement

- Mid-year status reports
- Emails (content based on the information needs, regular updates, links to documents)
- Online and in-person meetings (specific preferences? Topic and length? Meetings of the national commissions?)
- One-on-one meetings with relevant persons
- Information sessions
- Brainstorming sessions
- Consider the expertise of the stakeholders to plan the engagement activities
- Interdepartmental consultations to ensure all relevant government agencies are included

# RESULTS OF THE „STICKING NOTES“ EXERCISE

## Additional remarks

- VIDS and KAMPOS are not NGOs and cannot answer the session questions on behalf of all ITPs. Communities should be consulted first. → specific consultation process.

Considering the commissions and potential information flow in the coming months – how should communities in the interior stay updated and participate in an efficient manner?

- What is the position of the private sector to address climate challenges, engage with other stakeholders and join the GCF joint efforts?

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# RESULTS OF THE „STICKING NOTES“ EXERCISE

## Activities and responsibilities

### Available capacities:

- Capacity building for gender equality, stakeholder engagement, community development, communication for development (climate change)
- Gender analysis
- Stakeholder analysis
- Facilitation skills
- Project development, management, monitoring and evaluation
- Technical expertise in different topics, e.g. Information / methods on coastal zone protection, health
- Data and knowledge to be shared
- Local people involvement
- ITP members to lead consultations within their communities



**More clarity is needed on the GCF terminology for stakeholder to participate meaningfully.**

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# THEMATIC INPUT FOR THE COUNTRY PROGRAMME

Include biodiversity perspective (nature-based solutions)

Infrastructure & Housing - maintenance considerations (starting point - feasibility studies available?)

Collaboration with local communities, cultural considerations

Rice husk for power generation (starting point - feasibility studies available?)

Transport priorities (starting point - feasibility studies available?)

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# GCF PROJECT PIPELINE AND READINESS NEEDS

- Timeline of the concept note development
- Prospective ideas should send more information for the assessment

Several of the suggestions fit potential readiness activities:

- Improve data collection, analysis and disclosure (to what extent is this being addressed by current data initiatives? – what else would be missing?)
- Development of health National Adaptation Plan
- **Feasibility studies** of specific technologies regarding climate change impact e.g. Liquefied natural gas (LNG), rehabilitation of mine sites
- Nature-based solutions planning – sectoral approach
- Flooding management - sectoral approach (insurance fund development)
- Concrete adaptation planning – e.g. re-location of villages, economic activities

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# OTHER POTENTIAL READINESS NEEDS

- Mainstreaming climate across sectors (with a gender and ITP - sensitive approach)
- To strengthen the pipeline → Identification and assessment of **pilots and project experiences** for their ability to be scaled-up and lessons learned from previous investment and implementation experience are applied to new and/or innovative projects and programmes
- Incubating new business models and/or innovative financial mechanisms and schemes for mitigation and adaptation (engaging with the private sector)
