Progress Continues on Affordable Housing Project in Suriname as Contractors Begin Work and Key Milestones Are Reached

Paramaribo, Suriname – The Affordable Housing Project (AHP) continues to make significant strides in its efforts to improve housing across Suriname. October 2024 marked key developments, including progress on civil works, contract signings, and further administrative steps necessary for project implementation.

The China Dalian International Economic & Technical Cooperation Group Co., Ltd., which is handling the civil works at the project site in Voorburg, Commewijne, has maintained steady progress. Work on-site continues according to schedule, with focus on preparatory infrastructure as AHP moves into the next phase. In this phase, AHP has requested offers from companies for utilities services, a vital next step for completing the housing units.

A key milestone in October was the contract signing for beneficiaries in the Paramaribo and Wanica districts. This marks an important step toward launching construction activities on the ground. Contractors are now ready to begin work, including renovation, extensions, and new builds. The contracts formalize the partnership between the beneficiaries, contractors, and AHP, allowing construction to move forward in earnest.

In addition to the urban developments, AHP expanded its outreach to the hinterland districts. In October, AHP, in collaboration with the IFI (SPSB), traveled to the Brokopondo district to open bank accounts for beneficiaries in the area. These accounts are crucial for the deposit of subsidies, which are made possible through the Suriname-IsDB Bank agreement. This initiative ensures that beneficiaries in the hinterland can receive the financial support they need to improve their living conditions.

The affordable housing project is a collaboration between the **Surinamese government** and the **Islamic Development Bank** (**IsDB**). Its goal is to reduce the housing shortage in Suriname by providing various housing solutions in both urban and rural areas. The funding for this project has been made available by the IsDB through a loan taken out by the Surinamese government, which will result in the establishment of 3,375 housing solutions.
