The consulting services ("the Services") include technical assistance towards the establishment and the commissioning of the "Delfstoffen Authoriteit Suriname" (DAS) within the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) in the broad area of Procurement Administration. This support will be based on the existing vision for the DAS, international good practices, the Consultant's knowledge of Public Procurement Sector and familiarity with the Suriname mining sector. (1) The Consultant for the NPA assignment comes with general experience in private sector operational procurement and/or public procurement in general. Procurement in World Bank and/or International Financial Institutions financed projects would be considered a substantial advantage.

(2) Other Qualifications:

- Bachelor degree in civil procurement law, business, economics, or any other relevant field.
- Minimum 3 years of professional experience in terms of operational procurement support in the broad context of the implementation of projects in developing and emerging countries
- Practical knowledge of procurement, tendering and contracting processes and requirements to support successful implementation of projects ideally financed by International Financial Institutions such as the World Bank
- Hands-on mentality and team player even when not an official PIU-member, but at the same time possess the necessary skills to work Fluent in English (speaking, reading, writing)
